DR. RENEE POWELL is the second African American after Althea Gibson, U.S. Open and Wimbledon tennis champion to play on the LPGA TOUR. Renee competed in more than 250 events after joining the LPGA TOUR in 1967. William Powell was Renee's teacher-coach starting at age 3 and as she first began competing at age 12. Renee played collegiate golf at Ohio University for two years before transferring to Ohio State. She was captain of the women's golf team at both universities. Renee's talents as a clothing designer for a major fashion house in England resulted in her designs being featured in a front window display at Harrods Department store considered the world's most famous department store established in 1824.

Since leaving the LPGA Tour in 1980, Powell has devoted her life to introducing life skills and growing the game among vulnerable children, members of the military and golfers of all ages. Dr. Powell has also been an International Goodwill Ambassador making 25 trips to Africa.



DR. RENEE POWELL proclaimed HONORARY MEMBER

In February 2015, Dr. Renee Powell became one of seven female members and the first and only African American female member of The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St Andrews known as the home of golf.

Powell, joins several other notable women who accepted honorary membership in the Royal and Ancient Golf Club including Her Royal Highness The Princess Royal, Dame Laura Davies, Belle Robertson MBE, Lally Segard, Annika Sorenstam and Louise Suggs.

Powell was a LPGA Tour Professional competing in more than 250 events from 1967 to 1980. In 1979, she became the first woman head professional at a golf course in the United Kingdom at Silvermere near London. In concert with African embassies in the U.S. Renee taught golf in Africa with 25 trips as an International Golf Ambassador. She returned to the U.S. in 1988, working to build inner-city youth programs in Cleveland, establishing a network of celebrity and Pro-Am charity events, and touring historically black colleges where she helped attract new players to the game.

In 1996 she became the first African American female Class A member of The PGA of America. In 1999, she was named an honorary member of the LPGA Teaching & Club Professional Division. She also has served as development and programming consultant for *The First Tee* Program and in 2000, began the LPGA Girls Golf Club in East Canton. In 2001, *CLEARVIEW Golf Club* was listed among the National Register of Historic Places.

In 2003, Renée Powell received the PGA of America, *First Lady of Golf* award. In 2007, she received the inaugural LPGA ROLEX *For the Love of the Game* award. In 2008, the University of St. Andrews bestowed Renee with an honorary Doctor of Laws (LLD) followed by a Doctor of Public Service, University of Maryland, Eastern Shore in 2010.

"This is an historic day for the Club and we could not be more proud also to welcome women who have distinguished themselves in golf over many years and have been great players and champions. They are extremely worthy additions to our roll of honorary members and will become ambassadors for the Club as they have been for the sport of golf throughout their careers," said George Macgregor OBE, Captain of The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St Andrews.

Dr. William Powell a special relationship between a man, a golf course and a social justice legacy of 'Golf for Everyone'.



DR. WILLIAM "Bill" POWELL an American golf visionary and course architect designed, began construction in 1946, owned and opened his own golf course in less than 2 years in East Canton, Ohio. With the help of his wife, Marcella who passed away in 1996 and son Larry, nine additional holes were added in 1978.

In his autobiography, *CLEARVIEW: America's Course* (Foxsong Publishing, 2000), Powell called *CLEARVIEW* a labor of love and said it felt good to have left behind something meaningful as his legacy." I didn't build this course for any of the recognition," he said. "Golf is a part of society and I wanted to be included. I want you to be included, too."

The grandson of Alabama slaves, Powell was a WWII veteran who served in the U.S. Army Air Corp. Bill was a caddy as a young man and then captain and coach of his high school golf team. Powell played golf internationally while in military service. But when he returned home to Ohio after the war, he was denied membership to local golf courses and barred from playing on some area courses. Undeterred, Powell worked two jobs, found two business partners and used money raised from his brother mortgaging his home to turn a 78-acre dairy farm into a golf course.



Bill Powell began building his course, by hand, in 1946 and opened the first nine holes in 1948, completing the last nine holes in 1978. He named the course *CLEARVIEW Golf Club* for the beautiful, panoramic views visible from the highest point on the property.

In 1992, the Powells were honored by the National Golf Foundation as the *Jack Nicklaus Golf Family of the Year*. That same year, William was awarded the *Cornerstone of Freedom Award* from the Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Commission.

In 1996, William Powell was inducted into the National Black Golf Hall of Fame and in 1997 was presented Honorary PGA membership by the Northern Ohio PGA Section. In 1998, the Ohio Veterans Hall of Fame honored Powell and The Tiger Woods Foundation established the first annual William & Marcella Powell Scholarship Award. The \$1,000 scholarship is given annually to two Minerva High School graduating seniors who achieved academic excellence in spite of facing significant challenges. During 1999, Powell's PGA membership was made retroactive to January 1, 1962, thus making Powell a PGA Lifetime Member. The Smithsonian Institution invited Powell to discuss *African Americans and the Game of Golf: Past, Present and Future* as a national panelist. The Congressional Black Caucus awarded him its *Unsung Hero Award*. And the PGA honored him with a Lifetime Membership.

Dr. William Powell also received an honorary Doctor of Humane Letters degree from his alma mater, Wilberforce University, and Baldwin-Wallace College in Berea, Ohio. Powell celebrated in 2009 what he called "the best year of my life" - a season of tributes highlighted by the: 1) *PGA Distinguished Service Award*, the Association's highest honor; 2) Northern Ohio PGA Hall of Fame Ohio Golf Course Owners Association, *Person of the Year*; and 3) Canton Regional Chamber of Commerce, *Community Salute Award* to the Powell family. Black Enterprise honored Powell's contributions to golf at its 16th annual Golf & Tennis Challenge in September 2010.

Dr. Powell's golf legacy was honored by *The First Tee* which distributed more than 1,000 *William J. Powell Scholarships* allowing youngsters to attend *The First Tee Life Skills and Leadership Academies* conducted on college campuses. These young golfers competed for the *Dr. William J. Powell Outstanding Male Leader Award*. Endowed by Fred and Roddy Tattersall scholarships, participants from more than 100 cities in 30 states, Ireland, New Zealand and Singapore gained valuable character education and leadership instruction through workshops, career exploration seminars and golf clinics.

In her own words ...

Renee wants you to join her in "committing to *CLEARVIEW's legacy* as a beacon of light for everyone. Equality is achieved and protected only through the courageous acts of regular people who try to change the world one day at a time."

"You have to be the kind of person who has a lot of passion and a lot of compassion," she says. "You have to be the kind of person who truly wants to make this a better world."

In February 2015, Dr. Renee Powell became an honorary member of The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St Andrews, considered the birthplace of golf, months after ending its 260 year maleonly membership policy.

"I think back to the times that as a young black girl playing golf, there were many places I could not play or unpleasant situations when I was finally allowed to play, and now I belong to the most exclusive private golf club in the world," Powell told the Times.

"The momentousness of the occasion really hit me when I walked through the clubhouse door," said Powell who travelled from her home in East Canton, Ohio to attend events related to her honorary membership in Scotland.

"It's hard to believe that I now have my own locker in this distinguished clubhouse, that I can dine here, socialize and play the Old Course for the rest of my life. I stand on the shoulders of my parents and all of the golfers who braved prejudice to play the game we love."

In the pre-Tiger Woods era, Dr. Powell's efforts were groundbreaking. "What I enjoy most is working with people who want to learn," Powell said. "My biggest job is to carry on what has been put before me. I am here to create a level playing field and create opportunities for everyone. I want to grow the game of golf and let people know it's open to everyone. If I can create opportunities for people to walk through this door, I've done my job,"
